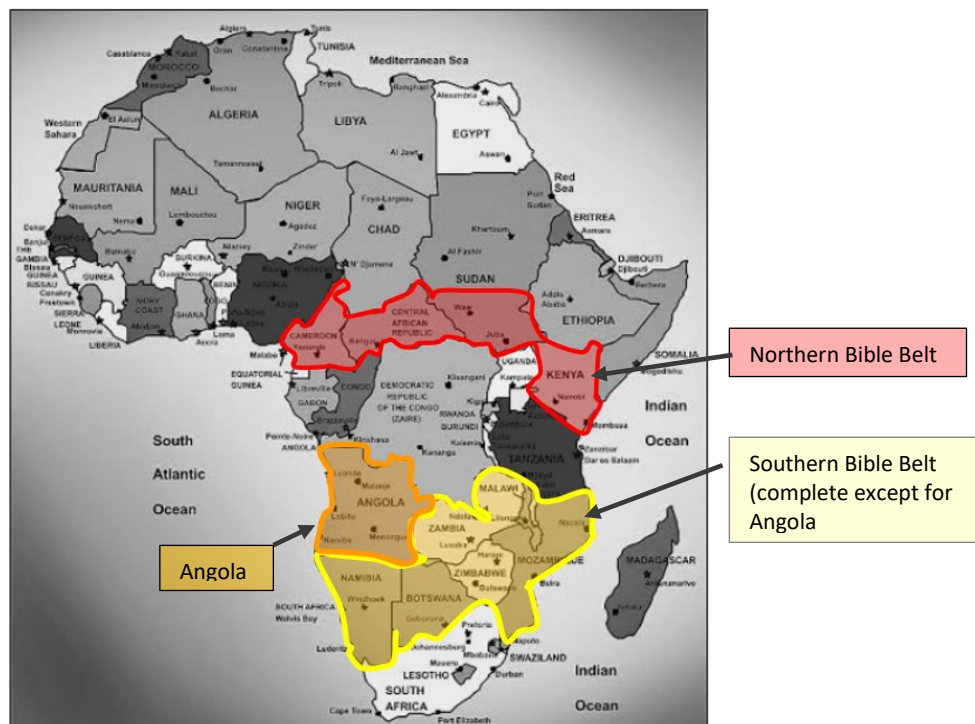
increasingly becomes a reality, and it is your unsung generosity that allows it.

Bibles for all Members of African Security Forces

I am pleased to advise you that 18,000 Bibles have now been ordered for the Ghana Military. It is our hope that Operation Africa will have the funds to put 20,000 Bibles per annum into Ghana until approximately 80,000 are in that nation. We will then seek to support Security Forces in nations to the east of Ghana over the coming years. However, last week a phone call was received from the United Kingdom from a retired British Military Chaplain and a Military General from Portugal. These two men were seeking Operation Africa's support to place 20,000 at least, and preferably 50,000 Bibles into Angola, which is just north of Namibia in the map shown below. A project such as this would have a value of about US\$110,000 for 20,000 Bibles. You can observe that the need is great.

I found the phone call very interesting and challenging because it was the same General who made contact with us to determine if Bibles could be placed in the Portuguese language in camouflage colours to the Mozambique Army. You may remember that in 2016, 15,000 Bibles were provided into that country in the Portuguese language having been printed in South America. We are advised the Bibles have had great effect. The majority of our Bibles are printed in either China or South Korea.

For your information I include a map showing the desire to build two Bibles Belts across Africa, as was previously indicated in our newsletter of January 2018.



As you can see, with an Angola project, the southern Bible Belt would be made larger. With respect to the northern Bible Belt, we are at the beginning, having started putting Bibles into Ghana, but over previous years have provided Bibles into South Sudan and Kenya which are part of the northern Bible Belt.

There is much to do, and we do pray that you will continue with your support for us. Our great need is for finances, and it is the single biggest restrictor to Operation Africa fulfilling its vision.

There has been considerable success to date and it is most encouraging to think that a Portuguese General would phone to Australia from London in the presence of a retired British Military Chaplain, seeking support for an Angolan Military Force.

Be encouraged and once again thank you – may He pour out His blessings upon you.
